Johannesburg Anglican Eco-spiritual Initiative (JAEI) Report for 2020

JAEI managed to keep the eco-spiritual movement going in the Diocese despite Covid-19 disrupting and cancelling our activities and plans.

Our first major activity, before Covid-19, was when Mr Luyanda Hlatshwayo from the African Reclaimers' Association (ARO) was our very inspiring guest speaker at our Annual General Meeting at St Joseph's Diocesan Centre on Saturday 22 February. He spoke of the life of a reclaimer and how we as churches and community members can work with the reclaimers to help save our environment and reduce the amount of refuse going into our landfill sites.

After Covid, we started what has become a very active JAEI WhatsApp group that remains full of fun and inspiring eco stories and messages. We reactivated our Facebook page, updated our website and many JAEI members joined the Green Anglicans gardeners group for the 4 dioceses in Gauteng. A big effort was our promotion of the most wonderful provincial wide Green Anglicans online Sunday Eucharist services that inspired hundreds every week. JAEI representatives preached in one service and provided the Eucharist filmed in the bush in several. The 19th September service was all JAEI people, except the preacher, and all were filmed outside!

We also encouraged our parishes to celebrate World Environment Day/Month in June and Season of Creation in September and on St Francis Day first Sunday of October. We continued to prepare and email the monthly JAEI prayer diary for every day of the year. We hope and pray that Covid-19 has made more people aware of God's Creation, its healing role, and how it's our Christian joy to preserve it.

We were heartbroken at the passing of our beloved treasurer Mark Franklin, who was an ecochampion and a joy to work with. May his soul rest in peace and rise in glory.
