The Christification of the Universe

The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. —John 6:51

Jesus the Christ did not talk in this truly shocking way (see John 6:60) so we could worship bread and wine. He came so that we would recognize his presence in all things, not just in the human body of Jesus, not just in the human body of God's people (1 Corinthians 12:12ff), but even in the nurturing elements of the earth, symbolized by the



ubiquitous food of bread and wine (1 Corinthians 11:23ff), and therefore to the very edges of creation (Romans 8:19). The mystery that was made personal and specific in Jesus was revealed as the shape of the entire universe. What else could the universe be but "the body of God"? Think about it. The Incarnate One is the stand-in for "everything in heaven and everything on earth" (Ephesians 1:10). This is not a competing religious statement as much as a highly symbolic metaphysical plan "from the beginning," "from the foundation of the world" (see Ephesians 1).

God is not just saving people; God is saving all of creation. It is all "Real Presence." We could call it the primordial "Christification" or anointing of the universe at Creation. This is not pantheism (God is everything), but panentheism (God is in everything!). Such a central message of cosmic incarnation was never seriously taught in the Western, overly individualistic church, except by a few like Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179), Francis of Assisi (1181-1226), and Bonaventure (1221-1274). It was much more common in the Eastern Church, especially in early scholars and mystics like Maximus the Confessor, Gregory of Nyssa, and Symeon the New Theologian.

Inspired by the more contemporary mystic scientist, Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, Franciscan sister and scientist Ilia Delio writes:

Christ invests himself organically within all creation, immersing himself in things, in the heart of matter, and thus unifying the world. The universe is physically impregnated to the very core of its matter by the influence of his superhuman nature. Everything is physically "christified," gathered up by the incarnate Word as nourishment that assimilates, transforms, and divinizes.

From the way we treat the planet, other humans, and sometimes even ourselves, it seems we don't understand or really believe this. When you don't recognize that the Christ Mystery is universal, that God is present in—and is saving—all of creation, you can choose what you respect and what you disrespect, what you love and what you hate. The full Gospel takes away from you any power to decide and discriminate where God is and where God isn't. The old Baltimore Catechism answered the sixteenth question, "Where is God?" quite clearly: "God is everywhere." But we never really believed it!

Encyclical Letter *Fratelli Tutti o*f Pope Francis on the Fraternity and Social Friendship

Chapter Two - Starting anew

- 77. Each day offers us a new opportunity, a new possibility. We should not expect everything from those who govern us, for that would be childish. We have the space we need for co-responsibility in creating and putting into place new processes and changes. Let us take an active part in renewing and supporting our troubled societies. Today we have a great opportunity to express our innate sense of fraternity, to be Good Samaritans who bear the pain of other people's troubles rather than fomenting greater hatred and resentment. Like the chance traveller in the parable, we need only have a pure and simple desire to be a people, a community, constant and tireless in the effort to include, integrate and lift up the fallen. We may often find ourselves succumbing to the mentality of the violent, the blindly ambitious, those who spread mistrust and lies. Others may continue to view politics or the economy as an arena for their own power plays. For our part, let us foster what is good and place ourselves at its service.
- 78. We can start from below and, case by case, act at the most concrete and local levels, and then expand to the farthest reaches of our countries and our world, with the same care and concern that the Samaritan showed for each of the wounded man's injuries. Let us seek out others and embrace the world as it is, without fear of pain or a sense of inadequacy, because there we will discover all the goodness that God has planted in human hearts. Difficulties that seem overwhelming are opportunities for growth, not excuses for a glum resignation that can lead only to acquiescence. Yet let us not do this alone, as individuals. The Samaritan discovered an innkeeper who would care for the man; we too are called to unite as a family that is stronger than the sum of small individual members. For "the whole is greater than the part, but it is also greater than the sum of its parts".[60] Let us renounce the pettiness and resentment of useless in-fighting and constant confrontation. Let us stop feeling sorry for ourselves and acknowledge our crimes, our apathy, our lies. Reparation and reconciliation will give us new life and set us all free from fear.
- 79. The Samaritan who stopped along the way departed without expecting any recognition or gratitude. His effort to assist another person gave him great satisfaction in life and before his God, and thus became a duty. All of us have a responsibility for the wounded, those of our own people and all the peoples of the earth. Let us care for the needs of every man and woman, young and old, with the same fraternal spirit of care and closeness that marked the Good Samaritan.



World Penguin Day

World Penguin Day on April 25 aims to raise awareness about these flightless birds - whose numbers and habitats are dwindling by the day – and to preserve their species so that future generations get to see these elegant and remarkable creatures. . The day also aims to bring international focus on the conservation of penguin habitats.

South Africa's own (and only) endemic African penguin has experienced rapid population declines over the past century as a result of overexploitation for food,



habitat modification of nesting sites, oil spillages, and competition for food resources with commercial fishing. As a result, it is classified as Endangered by the IUCN Red List and it is listed under Appendix II of the CITES (Convention on International Trade of Endangered Species). In South Africa, it is further listed as a protected species under the National Environment Management: Biodiversity Act (No. 10 of 2004)

The African penguins are undergoing very rapid population declines. The initial records of African penguin populations along the Namibia and South African coastline estimated around one million breeding pairs in the 1920s but these populations have rapidly declined to less than 30 000 pairs. For example, it is estimated that breeding population in South Africa has experienced a 95% decline in six years from 69 000 pairs in 2001 to 20 000 pairs in 2011. As a result it is projected that the African penguin may become extinct within the next 15 years. The African penguin play important roles in their ecosystem, both as a food source for sharks and seals and also act as predators to small fish such as anchovies and sardines.

Fisheries Management and closing fishing grounds around breeding colonies is one possible solution of saving these iconic little birds. Creating Marine Protected Areas around penguin colonies will protect schooling fish in these protected areas, reduce competition with fisheries, and result in there being more fish available for penguins to feed on.

However, these are policy decisions and are totally out of our hands, but there are steps we can take (even living many kilometres from the penguin's homes), and again it comes down to us reducing our impact on the earth.

Actions:

- Recycle at home
- Eat right
 - Look at the WWF SASSI list (sardine is orange)
 - o Is the meat you eat fed on wild caught anchovy?
 - o Eat local and in season fish
 - o Reduce your meat (including fish) consumption
- Shop better
 - o Reduce single use plastic use
 - Stop using plastic bags
 - Use less or no plastic packaging
 - o Reduce your carbon footprint
 - Walk or cycle where possible
- Hold Penguin Conservation Organisations up in prayer.

		International Hyena Day
Thursday	27	April 27 th is International Hyena Day which advocates for changing the public's perspective on hyenas and seeing their importance on Earth. Hyenas don't have the greatest reputation due to centuries of bad publicity through literature and folklore. Spread through Africa
		and Asia, hyenas are intelligent mammals living in clans of 10 to 120 animals. Hyena aren't just cunning killers, but they're also useful scavengers. The bone crushers will clean the site of a kill and rid it of discarded bones and debris. Predators will only eat the fleshy bits from their kill. Hyenas have highly acidic stomachs to break down their food, even though it isn't the freshest quality The scavenging behaviour of hyenas is a free disease control annually prevents five infections of anthrax and bTB in humans, and other animals.
		Their "demonic laugh" is often misunderstood, as it occurs when a lower-ranking animal is stressed. Hyenas are vulnerable to extinction because of habitat loss and persecution by farmers and poachers.
		Unfortunately, like many of Africa's animals, all types of hyenas are under threat due to habitat loss, legal and illegal hunting, and prey depletion. Trophy hunters seeking the largest hyenas mainly remove breeding females, which weakens the genetic viability and leadership experience of the clan.
		Hyenas are a valuable part of the eco-system and deserve so much more respect than what they currently receive.
		We can help hyenas by protecting their habitats and promoting sustainable land use practices. Disease control measures, such as vaccination programs for domestic animals, can also help to reduce the spread of diseases to wild Brown Hyena populations and yes, we do have populations of the rare Brown Hyena in the greater Witwatersrand area.

		Assess your own attitude to these remarkable animals and change negative to positive!
